A Brief History of Socelex


Maria Hennessy loved animals and as a child, dreamt of running away to join a circus. After found a job at a circus, her dream soon became a nightmare as she discovered that the elephants were being grossly mistreated.



After leaving the circus, Maria hitchhiked to Nepal and India with her son Shane, to monitor the treatment of elephants and then to Japan to tend sick circus elephants before hiring a Jumbo jet to fly them to a safari park in Argentina. Later, in Afghanistan, she persuaded army guards to let her into a compound to help an injured elephant. It was thus that Maria founded Socelex (the Society Against Elephant Exploitation.

Maria found that other animals needed her help and Socelex expanded to include any animal that needed care. Maria learnt a great deal about animal medicine and nursed many of the animals herself but Maria had cancer and she sadly died in August 1996. Her brother John and son Shane, together with a small team of helpers were left to carry on her work.

In 1996, Diane Allen visited Socelex through her work with the Cat Protection group and fell in love with the place. She had many years experience fund-raising for the cats and turned her skills to help the

Maria & Diane are greatly missed at Socelex, their good works have helped many animals and that work continues in their memories today.

After three bad winters, we have to make sure we have plenty of bedding: straw, duvets and blankets; Rabbit food and corn for the birds and nuts for the sheep. Then comes cat litter and big bags of shavings. Everything our animals need has to be in stock before the real bad weather starts.

At Socelex, it's been a busy year again with lots of animals needing our care. We've had a lot of kittens and young cats in a very bad condition, with fleas and eye problems, the cause is usually because they simply haven't been looked after properly, or because they were taken away from their mother too soon.

A few of the litters we had in are also wild which makes everything that much harder to do. Just washing and de-fleaing becomes a battle, however, the rewards are good for them and for us; except for a few scratches, everything is ok.
